Denton is taking a strategic approach to water conservation by implementing a TWICE a week irrigation schedule.

This schedule is already in effect and will be in place year-round.

Additionally, from June 1 to Sept. 30, irrigation is prohibited from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Below, you will find your assigned irrigation days based on the last number in your address.

FAQs



Does this mean I can't water my foundation?

Foundation watering is not considered irrigation; watering by hand or soaker hose is permitted at any time.

I have a new tree that needs to be watered more frequently as it gets established. What do I do?

Hand-watering, drip irrigation systems, and bubblers are very efficient, and not included in the irrigation schedule. You may water any day as needed using these methods.

My HOA requires my lawn to be green, even in August, how do I comply with both the city and my HOA?

Good news! 1 inch of water per week is all that your lawn needs to stay green. Denton is one of the last DFW cities to implement a watering schedule. Many other cities maintain green lawns while only allowing irrigation one day per week. We will be working with HOAs to ensure they are aware of the new irrigation schedule.

What about my hose-end sprinkler?

Hose-end sprinklers are included in the irrigation schedule.

Does this mean we are in a drought?

It does not. By implementing an irrigation schedule, we are being proactive and conserving water to avoid a drought situation.

I pay for my water, shouldn't I be able to use it how I want?

Irrigation is the largest discretionary use of water. By using water strategically, we are avoiding major spikes in demand. During the fall, winter, and spring months, our customers use about half of what is used in peak summer heat. If we strategically spread out our irrigation demand, our spikes are less extreme. This allows us to keep our rates low.
